Introduction to museum ethics



This day aims to identify key ethical issues in the changing landscapes of museums today and to introduce you to elements of the Museum Association's Code of Ethics. It will also provide you with an opportunity to work through relevant case studies and discuss ethical issues that arise in your everyday work.

- provide participants with practice in analyzing the ethical dimensions of museum practices and purposes with reference to simple case studies

- place museum ethics within the context of professional recognition and responsibility in the UK.

NEW! Developing and evaluating online learning resources







This course will provide practical training on developing e-learning resources aimed principally at people planning or just beginning to incorporate e-learning programmes into their organisation's work.

NEW! Writing a collection care plan





Collections care is an essential part of managing and maintaining a successful museum. It is a requirement of Museum Accreditation that a planned programme is in place to institute improvements in collection care, to ensure that these improvements are made over time, on the basis of priority. This can be achieved through the development and implication of a Collection Care Plan.

This course builds on the basic collections care issues and assumes some prior collections care knowledge and experience.

Course objectives:

- identifying strategic aims in collections care
- setting objectives specific to your organisation
- developing a collection care plan
- identifying resources
- learning how to measure implementation
- evaluating the plan.

At the end of the course, participants will be familiar with the collection care planning process and the various aspects of the Collection Care Plan. They will have acquired the skills and knowledge to develop such a plan for their own organisation. The outline of a plan for their own situation will have been made during the course.
